General Guidelines

- As a general rule, ski and snowboard equipment with bindings is allowed for use at Diamond Peak. If there are not bindings, it is not allowed.
- If a device is being used as an accessibility device, it is approved for use.

Allowed	
<p>Alpine Skis</p>  <p>Skis with normal alpine bindings</p>	<p>Snowboards</p>  <p>Snowboard with bindings. Only one foot must be strapped in while loading, riding and unloading the lift.</p>
<p>Telemark Skis</p> 	<p>Snowblades</p>  <p>Short skis that have bindings</p>
<p>Adaptive Equipment</p> 	<p>Any adaptive piece of equipment that is designed for adaptive skiing/riding is allowed. This includes, but is not limited to sit skis and ski bikes.</p>

Restricted Equipment

Ski Bikes



Allowed as an accessibility device only

Not Allowed

Snow Skates



Skateboard with mini-snowboard attached to the bottom. No bindings, therefore not allowed.

Pow Surfers



Snowboard with no bindings, therefore not allowed.

Snow Decks



Skateboard with slick surface on the bottom. No bindings, therefore not allowed.

Sleds



Sleds are not allowed at Diamond Peak at any time.

Babies in Backpacks/Front Packs



Not allowed on lifts or ski runs.

Children must have their own ski/snowboard equipment and sit on the lift next to the parent.
